A dissemination conference featuring the partnership work of four Local Authorities that have worked for two years with their local Development Education Centres.

Each partnership worked with primary schools through the work of an AST, Lead Professionals or consultants.

This event is an opportunity to share in the classroom activities that enabled schools to embed Global Education in the primary curriculum.

Most primary teachers are aware of the Independent Review of the Primary Curriculum led by Sir Jim Rose and the recently published Interim Report.

What does this mean for Global Education?

The conference will begin with a keynote presentation from the QCA which will explore the recommendations of the committee in the context of the global dimension.

HULL DEC with North Lincolnshire Council

Focussing on the journey that one school has made from a first introduction to the Global Dimension to working towards the Global Schools Award

Joan Thompson, a former Head Teacher in North Lincolnshire, has worked for the past two years as Global Awareness Consultant in the Local Authority.

This workshop will use a DVD put together by one school, to demonstrate the journey it has made in working towards the Global Schools Award.

The workshop will be facilitated by Joan and the school's Head Teacher, who will be happy to share their experiences with other teachers and Local Authority participants.

SOUTH YORKSHIRE DEC with Rotherham Council

Working with a network of schools in Rotherham on whole school development

This workshop will be an opportunity for participants to learn about the two year partnership project between Rotherham Ethnic and Cultural Diversity Service, DEC(SY) and 9 diverse primary schools across Rotherham.

Bev Booker (Service Leader for Ethnic Minority Children), Helen Griffin (Education Officer, DECSY) and a teacher from one of the schools involved will:

- Describe how the partners worked together
- Describe the impact of the project on the partner schools
- Give some examples of activities undertaken by the schools involved (including bringing a global dimension to the new literacy framework)

LEEDS DEC with School Linking Network (Bradford)

Global Dimension work through Local Linking with an emphasis on Community Cohesion

This workshop will explore the opportunities and challenges of using the Global Dimension as a focus for joint curriculum development in primary school linking on a local basis and how this could be adopted as a model for other Local Authorities.

The work has been developed with the Schools Linking Network (SLN) based in Bradford which works nationally as well as locally.

The workshop will be jointly led by Gail Smith, the Lead Professional working with SLN and Trish Sandbach from Leeds DEC and will be active, participatory and practical.

YORK Centre for Global Education (CGE) with York City Council

An interactive workshop focussing on a Global Teacher network, looking at trial activities and focussing on the sustainability of Global Dimension work in the Local Authority

Nicola Betts, York AST for the Global Dimension, worked with 16 schools over the past two years, her role being to help schools embed a global dimension into their curriculum and create a global whole school ethos. This led to the creation of a Global Dimension Learning Network which meets termly and supports a similar number of schools in further developing global curriculum planning. Some of these schools are now working towards the Global Schools Award with support from CGE.

The workshop, facilitated by Mick Bradley and Jenny Zobel (CGE) and a teacher from one of the schools involved will:

- Give some examples of activities undertaken by Nicola in the schools covering areas of the global dimension such as human rights, sustainable development, interdependence/Fair Trade and conflict resolution
- Describe how the partners worked together
- Describe the impact of the project on the partner schools
- Outline how this has helped to build sustainability of Global work in the Local Authority
